

## Note From The Pastor



#### **Fatherly Love**

Pray then like this: Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. (Matthew 6:9-13)

Jesus told his disciples that they should honor their Father God in heaven as their supreme Father; the one who loves them perfectly. On June 16<sup>th</sup> we celebrate Father's Day with thanks and honor toward our not so perfect Earthly fathers.

I feel that I have a great father and yet not perfect. I was raised in the Catholic Faith, praying the rosary every day, monthly confession to a priest to relieve built up guilt for sins, and Church attendance every Sunday was a priority in our life. My father also modeled discipline, respect for others, work ethic, and compassionate service to others. We really bonded on vacations and bike rides including two annual weeklong bike rides across Iowa (RAGBRAI). But not all people are blessed with a father who has modeled love for them and others.

Often we are presented with opportunities to love someone with fatherly type love. Yes some women are left to be both a mother and a father influence in the lives of their children. Some men have spent time as mentors to kids who come from dysfunctional families where the father is absent. Many of us may find opportunities to bless others with fatherly love.

I have noticed that many in this congregation are very intentional about connecting and building relationships with youth in this church and in the community. It is this kind of attention that builds confidence in these kids. When a child is recognized with praise and encouragement, they are more likely to participate in the life of the church in later years.

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. (1 John 3:1 NIV)

May you share the grace of God's perfect love with all of God's children.... For God is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

#### ST. OLAF FOUNDATION

Hi – I am Bob Younie and am the Treasurer of the Saint Olaf Lutheran Church Foundation.

I have been a member of Saint Olaf since 1978 when Karen, 2-year-old Erin and I moved to Fort Dodge. That membership continues to be a blessing to me.

My purpose today is to recognize the students who are receiving educational scholarships from the Foundation.

Before those recognitions, I would like to mention that the Foundation has a long history of helping student with their college expenses. It is the Foundation privilege to invest \$34,500 in scholarships this year for individual scholarships, and also for scholarship help to Luther Seminary and to Wartburg Theological Seminary in the amount of \$7,000 each.

The Foundation's scholarship investment in the youth of our church over the last ten years is \$362,050.

As a point of information, the scholarship application process requires two things: 1) The student must be a Saint Olaf member, and 2) The on-line scholarship application form needs to be submitted by the stated date. The Foundation does the work from that point on. The scholarship money goes directly from the Foundation to the educational institution; the student and parents are not involved in that transfer of funds.

An important point is that a scholarship application is not a one-and-done process; each education year requires a new scholarship application.

The students receiving scholarships this year are: Conner Carver, Andrew Dutcher, Maddy Dutcher, Jace Johnson, Makayla Johnson, Drayton Miller, Max Morud, Iris Peimann, Madigan Peimann, Drew Szalat and Laila Taylor.

School may be out for the summer, but LSI continues to serve lowans year-round. Our Early Childhood team continues their in-home visits, ensuring young families are supported and connected to their community as they raise the next generation of lowans. Our therapists are talking and, most importantly, listening to individuals struggling with mental health challenges, difficult situations at home, and seemingly simple everyday problems. Children in our Foster Care and Adoption services are bonding with their foster parents as they grow and learn in their community. Immigrant and refugee learners gather at LSI offices in Des Moines, Sioux City, and Waterloo to attend class as they prepare for their citizenship test, learn how to become financially stable, practice their English skills, and more. Global Greens farmers are busy at the farm or selling their produce at the Global Greens Farmers Market in Des Moines.
